Greetings and Happy Spring! It is the time of year when temperatures warm up and people are getting outside more. What do you look forward to in Spring/Summer in Cass City? It's a time when our Farmers Market opens, there is Music in Rotary Park starting June 23, fun and fireworks at the Freedom Festival beginning June 29, and our flowers are put out on Main Street to welcome all to Cass City.

I am happy to share with you that the Cass City Rotary Club has plans to reimage Rotary Park with a new Sensory Garden for the community equipped with new landscaping, textile pathways, and musical features. Rotary also plans to make improvements to the Disc Golf course located in the woodland trails in the Municipal Park.

You will be hearing more about a plan to award an existing or new business in the Downtown District a grant to grow a business. This new program is called Business Builders and will stimulate economic development on Main Street. Staff will work with Tuscola County EDC to create and implement this program. Look for more information to come on Business Builders in the near future.

Parks & Recreation

As the temperatures warm up, the excitement grows for the summer days when we can open the Helen Stevens Memorial Pool and Splash Park. We plan to offer swimming lessons again this year. The Day Camp Program is scheduled for this summer too. More information on these programs is available by contacting the Municipal Building.

The Bark Park

The Bark Park Committee is continuing to fundraise for a dog park in the Municipal Park, and they are halfway to the goal of \$54,146. The proposed dog park would have a fenced area for large dogs, a separate area for small dogs, and an entry area. Plans are to have a water fountain on the premises along with other amenities. One of the most important components will be the dog waste station. Users will be asked to clean up after their pets, and the other park maintenance such as mowing the lawn will be provided by the Village staff. Fleet

The Village has two dump trucks that are in need of replacement. These dump trucks are the "work horses" for the DPW. They are showing their age with excessive repair and maintenance. The 1989 Ford F-700 truck is on order and scheduled to be replaced in 2023. The 1998 F-700 dump truck with blade and scraper is scheduled for replacement in 2024. The 2023 Capital Improvement Plan includes \$150,000 for this purchase. The Village has been saving for these expenditures and funds are available in the Motor Vehicle Fund.

Recycling

The Village has a new supply of recycling bins from Emterra available at the Municipal Building. Recycling should be placed at the curb on regular trash days. Tuscola County Recycling Center also collects recycling every Friday from 9 am—12:30 pm, in the parking lot behind the Municipal Building.

Downtown Development Authority (DDA)

The Downtown Development Authority (DDA) will be working with Main Street businesses and property owners to "spruce up" the downtown. Plans include window washing and designer films on windows for visual appeal to create a more vibrant and welcoming Downtown District.

Spring can be a messy time of year, but especially after a construction project. The lawn restoration performed in the fall on North Seeger needs some attention, and is planned for this Spring. It may not look pretty right now, but give it time.

There are no major road projects planned for 2023. The Village Council will evaluate urgent repairs for this summer. The MDOT funds and road millage cannot fund major projects annually, and with the economy, the Village will pause infrastructure investment this year to save up funds for next year's road project(s).
